




£4 million

Major refurbishment of a 1920s Tudor 'Arts & Crafts' style house with substantial extensions to create a new pool wing, garage wing with bedrooms above, kitchen and orangery. Landscape design of separate garden rooms as well as boundary walls, railings and gates.

**St Margaret's Church, Uxbridge**2017
Grade I listed

Options appraisal for re-ordering the interior and two storey side extension to one of the oldest buildings in Uxbridge to include new multi-use rooms and toilet accommodation.

**Croydon Minster**2005 – Present
Grade I listed

The church has Saxon origins with medieval and Victorian work. Daniel is inspecting architect and has prepared a quinquennial and provides general advice. Including, over the past ten years, re-roofing of the north and south aisles, stonework repairs, furniture design and toilet accommodation.

**Audley End House**2014 – 2015

Grade I listed / Scheduled Ancient Monument

Project Architect for the conservation and repairs to this historic English Heritage property in Essex. Work included the conservation and repairs to the external clunch and kettton stone facades, window repairs and redecoration, repairs to lead roofing and, internally repairs and strengthening of the 17th century oak staircase, repairs to a lime plaster ceiling and the complete refurbishment, redecoration and representation of one of the State Rooms.

**St Mary's, Wimbledon**2014
£150,000
Grade II* listed


Project Architect for the reshingling of the spire and associated leadwork and stone parapet repairs to this iconic church. The project involved the restoration of the oak tracery to four lucarne windows and providing better access onto the tower parapet. In addition, the opportunity was taken to carry out miscellaneous repairs to the south aisle roof and gutters, renew areas of stone flooring and to service the clock faces.

**St Mary's Kilburn**2014
£70,000
Grade II Listed

Project Architect for the conservation and repairs to the west front of St Mary's church, Kilburn. The work included stone repairs, tracery window repairs, a new apex cross and gentle washing of the elevation.

**Leeds Castle, Maidstone, Kent**2013 – 2014
£400,000
Grade I listed

Project Architect for the complete reroofing and stonework repairs to the Gate Tower building at Leeds Castle. Work also included installation of a man-safe system on the roofs, trace heating to the gutters and conservation and repairs to internal oak framing and plaster ceilings.

**Osborne House, Swiss Cottage**2012 – 2014
£800,000
Grade II* Listed

Project Architect for the restoration, redecoration and representation of this important collection of four buildings in a listed landscape built by Queen Victoria and Prince Albert on the grounds of the Osborne House, Isle of Wight. The work, for English Heritage, included extensive fabric conservation and repairs, discrete installation of new fire, lighting and security systems, reroofing and the careful and detailed restoration of the historic interiors, exteriors and landscaping. Detailed historical analysis was organized to determine original materials, colours and finishes.

**Herbert Crescent, Knightsbridge, London**2010 – 2011
£1.5 million

Project Architect for the substantial refurbishment and restoration of a large Victorian town house. The house when bought by the client was a gutted shell. The works included the complete rebuilding of the house internally in eclectic period style and the discrete installation of new M+E, security, environmental and A/V systems. Externally, the work included complete re-roofing, replacement of plastic windows with timber to the original design, brick and terracotta repairs and cleaning.

**Manor Farmhouse, Laverstoke**2009 – 2010
£600,000

Project Architect for the refurbishment and substantial new extensions to an existing brick and flint house on the banks of the River Test in Hampshire. Work included conservation and conversion of existing brick and flint stable building into guest accommodation.

**St Mary the Virgin, Great Brickhill**2009 – 2010
£300,000

Back-to-back projects to replace with new the lead roof to the North Aisle and re-hanging the bells, on a new frame, in the central tower. The work included salvaging historic timbers, designing and installing panelling for the ringing chamber, new lighting within the tower spaces and casting of two additional bells.



Grade II* listed
